The Big Ambition – Have Your Say!

carers participating, making it one of the largest surveys of its kind.

Help Us to Improve Attendance



I know how the vast majority of our parents/carers work so hard and are dedicated to improving regular attendance, and this is one of our school top priorities too. So many of you are going above and beyond to ensure your children are on time and in school every day – and I want to say thank you once again for the brilliant work you are doing. Alongside our school's commitment to improving attendance, we are not alone in tackling challenges around absence. The Department for Education (DfE) and Local Authority (LA) are working with key partners like the

NHS, neighbouring local authorities and the Attendance Action Alliance to put a wide range of support in place.

<u>Although our attendance rates are generally good, they are not yet good enough!</u> I am sure as parents/carers I do not need to remind you that moments matter, attendance counts – not just because of the importance of learning, but because of the wider holistic benefits for children's wellbeing and happiness.

At the end of last term our attendance rate for the whole school (Reception to Year 6) stood at 93.8% This is against a nationally recognised attendance target of 96+%. Sadly our number of children identified as persistently absent (below 90%) or severely absent has also increased – 102 children in total.

Let this new spring term be an opportunity for us all to work at improving attendance rates across the school - like you, I want as many children as possible through our school gates this term relaxed, refreshed and ready to learn.

Coats!

With the cold, wintry weather arriving recently and a flurry of snow it is yet another chance to give a general reminder about coats. Rather worryingly we still have a growing number of children who seem to come to school without a coat. Many of you may arrive by car in the morning but the children still need a coat in school to wear at morning break and lunchtime.



I would also point out that the Year 6 Leavers' hoodie is not a substitute for a coat. Year 6 parents/carers will have received a separate communication via Parent Hub from Mrs Antrobus (Upper School Team Leader).

Please ensure your child has a coat in school every day and that it is clearly named. The staff are constantly reminding children to put their coats on during the day and we hope by wrapping up we can prevent coughs and colds developing. Thank you.

Essex & Thames SCITT

We are delighted to be contuining our partnership with the Essex & Thames SCITT. This partnership involves the school working with Essex & Thames Primary SCITT to help train and produce high quality teachers. The continuing improvement of pupil progress and the well-being of children are at the heart of this collaboration and inform all aspects of the training. There is also a close relationship between the SCITT, Anglia Ruskin University and the school which provides an ideal environment for the exchange of ideas that informs practice across the partnership. As part of this work we have welcomed another SCITT student this term, **Mr William Hart** who will be on placement with us for the spring and summer terms. Mr Hart will be based in Year 5 and work closely alongside Mrs Antrobus in 5A. I am sure you will join me in welcoming him to St Thomas' Primary School and wish him every success on his placement with us.

Curriculum Information Leaflets for Parents – Spring Term 2024

Hopefully by now you will have received, via Parent Hub, a copy of the new Spring Term 2024 curriculum information guide for parents and carers. These are produced by teaching staff as a guide and indication of the themes and topics being covered this term. Please take the time to read this through and discuss it with your child. We hope it will give you some ideas about how you can support your child's learning and homework. We would highlight and promote the opportunities to research curriculum themes at the local library, via the internet or by visiting a museum. The most important thing is to talk to your child and find out what they have been doing and learning. If there are any aspects of the work your child is covering which you feel you may be able to offer help or advice with then please approach your child's classteacher. Thank you for your support!

Year 3 Swimming



Lessons for the children in Year 3 (3DW & 3BW) will begin on Friday 2^{nd} February 2024. I would like to remind parents that we very much rely on your payments to cover the cost of swimming lessons of £45 per child. In recent years we have seen the cost of pool hire rise at St. Helen's as well as the cost of swimming teachers increasing. I hope you will agree that this remains excellent value for money. If there are reasons why your child cannot take part in swimming lessons this must be

discussed with your child's classteacher or the School Office. Please ensure your child has the correct swimming kit in school on Friday's. Please could we encourage you to make a prompt payment via our online payment system www.parentpay.com. If you feel you may have difficulty in paying this amount and would like to discuss this confidentially then please arrange to speak with Mrs Lawrence in the School Office. Thank you for your support and understanding in this matter.

May I remind you that all children have to wear a suitable costume for swimming (no beach wear!) and a swimming hat. Swimming hats are available via ParentPay at a cost of £3.50. It is a really good idea to write your child's name on their hat in large letters in a thick permanent marker as this helps the swimming teachers to call their names and also reduces the risk of it becoming lost.
