As well as being a highly valued member of our LSA team, Mrs Emery also holds the post of School Librarian as well as Clerk to the Governing Body. Two very different but equally important roles. Over the course of the remainder of this term we will be looking to recruit and fill these various vacancies and responsibilities to allow us to continue the good work in all of these areas.

Parents' Evening 2025



Our Autumn Term Parents' Evenings 2025 will once again be conducted virtually via video appointment. Our previous experiences of using virtual video appointments for Parents' Evening shows a greatly increased attendance rate and the ability to ensure the meetings are conducted in a timely and efficient manner. It also means you can join from the comfort of your own home without having to come back to the school on a cold, damp autumn evening or worry about child care. We do plan to have hybrid (face-to-face or virtual) Parents' Evenings in the Spring Term 2026.

We will be facilitating our virtual video appointments for Parents' Evening using a purpose built platform provided by **SchoolCloud**. On Monday 20th October we will be sending out further details via Parent Hub about how this will work and how you go about booking video appointments with your child's classteacher.

Appointments will be available on Wednesday 5th November and Thursday 6th November 2025 between 4:00p.m. and 7:00p.m. The appointments will be kept strictly to 10 minutes per child.

You will be sent instructions about how to book and log in to these video appointments where you will be able to see and speak to your child's classteacher to discuss how your child has started the new academic year 2025-2026, their progress so far, any gaps that are apparent in their learning and how we can work together to best support their continued achievement over the course of this academic year.

As with our face to face appointments children must not attend these virtual video meetings as it is important that they are conducted in a professional manner and parents and classteachers can have discussions without interruptions and maximise the limited time. The meeting should be conducted in a quiet environment free from distraction.

School Development Plan 2025-2026

Following our Full Governing Body Business Meeting on the 25th September 2025, I have pleasure in drawing your attention to our new School Development Plan key priorities for 2025-2026 which were approved at this meeting.

The School Development Plan (SDP) is formulated as a result of our reflections and responses to our Local Authority monitoring and support visits, external moderation of standards and quality assurance exercises as well as our own rigorous and regular internal monitoring, self-evaluation and review of standards and achievement. We have also given deep consideration to our school Christian values and Christian distinctiveness.

The complete SDP is a comprehensive, robust and lengthy document and we have chosen to share with you the key priorities which are succinct by design. We want it to be a 'living' document which will help steer the school to become even better. The key priorities will be overseen by the Governing Body, its various committees as well as members of the Senior Leadership Team (SLT).

REMINDER – Winter School Uniform

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you that AFTER the October half term holiday all children must be wearing winter uniform.

WINTER

[Must be worn for the second half of the autumn term and spring term]

EYFS/KS1

Grey skirt or pinafore dress, *white polo shirt, *bottle green cardigan or jumper, White/grey/black socks or plain green/grey/black tights.

Grey tailored trousers (or tailored shorts), *white polo shirt, *bottle green jumper Grey or black socks only.



Key Stage 2

Grey skirt or pinafore dress, white shirt, school tie.

*bottle green cardigan or jumper,

White/grey/black socks or plain green/grey/black tights.

Grey tailored trousers (or tailored shorts), white shirt, school tie,

*bottle green jumper,

Grey or black socks only.

This means all children in Key Stage 2 wearing ties and white shirts with collars.

N.B. Items marked * must have the school badge embroidered on the garment.



Shoes need to be sensible black leather (<u>no trainers or boots</u>). We do not like lights or toys in the shoes so please bear this in mind when you are purchasing any new shoes.

Jewellery can cause problems in school due to Health & Safety requirements. Children may wear an inexpensive watch (no Smart watches) to school providing it is not too big or colourful and they will not be distracted by wearing it. No bracelets, rings or necklaces are permitted. Children are not allowed to wear earrings for PE under any circumstances so it makes sense to leave these at home altogether. However, if you insist on your child wearing earrings please ensure they are plain gold or silver studs and that they are capable of taking their earrings out themselves.

May I also remind you that long hair must be tied back with a black, white or green hairband. We prefer boys to have short hair. <u>Children's hair must not be coloured or have patterns shaved into it.</u>

Children's Chosen Charity...or Charities!

During the Autumn Term each year we turn our attention and thoughts to deciding and selecting this year's charity. I am delighted to report that after much debate, deliberation and moral dilemmas the children, supported by their CATS reps, have voted to support not one, but TWO charities which are very close to our hearts and relevant to our school community. The two charities are: **Kids Inspire** and **Rock UK**.

Kids Inspire is a children's mental health charity offering free trauma support to families who otherwise couldn't afford it. Their mission is to ensure that all children and families get the necessary support they need to recover from trauma. At the heart of Kids Inspire is a simple belief – every child deserves the chance to thrive! Through our membership of the Brentwood Collaborative Partnership (BCP) we have direct access to Kids Inspire therapists who work in school on a regular basis. Many of our families have



valued their support and intervention and this is a charity we have greatly benefited from and would like to give something back in terms of our fundraising.



Rock UK have been transforming young lives since 1922. As a charity supported through kindness and generosity, they look to see young lives changed through the experience of outdoor adventure. At Rock UK young people grow in confidence, see their fears challenged and learn more about their own spiritual, mental and physical capabilities. This we witness first hand every year, as our Year 6 children and staff are welcomed so warmly to the Rock UK Summit Centre in South Wales.

These are two very worthy causes and ones which we have directly benefited from in the past. As we move through this academic year there will be lots of opportunities to support both Kids Inspire and Rock UK and I hope you will give generously to these very important causes.

Operation Christmas Child 2025



Operation Christmas Child is a charity we have continued to support for many years. Once again we are asking the children and you as parents/carers to support Operation Christmas Child through their annual shoebox appeal. If you would like to purchase a flatpack, decorated shoebox they are now on sale at school from each classroom (ask your classteacher!) for **50p** each...while stocks last!

Thanks to your generosity all our shoeboxes and the gifts they contain go to children suffering through war, poverty, natural disaster and disease in countries in Eastern Europe and beyond.

I hope in the run up to Christmas and on Christmas Day itself you will spare a thought for these children receiving our shoeboxes! Last year we managed to package up and send off **105** shoeboxes for this appeal – let's see if we can beat this total this year!!
