It is so important that we mark Armistice Day or Remembrance Day (11th November) in this way and give thanks for all those who have made the ultimate sacrifice.

I have witnessed a growing number being carried into school and carefully stored in the classrooms and corridors over the past few weeks. Reception Admissions for September 2026

As you may be aware, the primary school (Reception) admission round opened on **Monday 10th November 2025** for parents/carers of children to apply for a Reception school place for the academic year that starts in September 2026. Even if you have a sibling at our school already, you still need to apply if your child is due to start in Reception in September 2026.

The statutory national closing date for applications is 15th January 2026.

From 10th November 2025, applications can be made online via www.essex.gov.uk/admissions. 99% of parents/carers in Essex applied online last year. All of the application information is available from this website.

UK Houses of Parliament

On Thursday 13th November we were delighted to take our House Captains, Sports Captains, Music Captains and KS2 CATS reps on an educational visit and tour of the UK Houses of Parliament.
