It is certainly continuing to feel a lot like Christmas as we journey through this season of Advent, a time for preparation and anticipation of the birth of Jesus Christ celebrated on Christmas Day. Our Advent wreath now has two purple candles alight, with the third pink/rose candle lit at the beginning of this week to remind us of John the Baptist who came to prepare the way for Christ - *"St. John the Baptist was the herald for the imminent Messiah..."*

It was wonderful to welcome parents/carers and other friends of the school this morning, as we came together as a school community in fellowship to celebrate our 'Preparing for Christmas' Eucharists with Fr. Mark in the school halls. Once again it gave us an opportunity to really focus on the true meaning of Christmas, in amongst the many festive distractions we face at this time of year.

I would like to take this opportunity, once again, to congratulate all the EYFS & Key Stage 1 staff and children on their superb performance of *'A Miracle in Town'* earlier this month. I am sure there were some very proud parents/carers, grandparents and other family members who were amazed at the confidence and talent on display...it certainly got us all in the festive spirit of Christmas! Following the retiring collections after the three performances we raised a fantastic **£549.60** for our school charities, **Kids Inspire** and **Rock UK**.

Last week it was the turn of our Lower Key Stage 2 children to put on a wonderful Christmas performance of *'Angels Up High!'* It was a joy to watch and to witness the amazing individual gifts and talents on display – we certainly had some angels with attitude! My thanks also go to all the staff who have worked so hard to ensure all the performances were of such a high quality despite the many challenges we have had to contend with – mainly sickness absence. It is hard to convey to you how much time, effort, energy and love go in to these performances from all the staff involved. Thanks to your generous donations at the end of the Lower Key Stage 2 performances we raised a further **£557.54** for Kids Inspire and Rock UK.

On Tuesday our Upper Key Stage 2 Christmas Carol Concert took place in the Key Stage 2 Hall. This was a very thoughtful and moving collection of carols, hymns and readings which took us through the sequence of events which unfolded on that first Christmas. Thank you to all those that attended and joined in with some hearty singing of those more traditional carols. At our retiring collection another **£434.86** was raised – giving us a grand total of **£1,542**. Sadly, we had many children not able to return for the evening concert performance so we will be reviewing this for next year, with the possibility of holding two afternoon performances instead to ensure all children are able to participate and support this important annual event.

In addition, and back by popular demand, we also held another festive treat on Wednesday afternoon as the children and staff from across the primary school took part in the festive **'Santa Dash'**. This involved completing the Daily Mile whilst listening to Christmas music and wearing an assortment of Christmas hats and hairbands. It was a great opportunity to see our school community coming together with the older children helping out the younger ones to clock up the laps. By the end of the afternoon there were certainly a few red faces and red noses but huge smiles all round.

The celebration of Christmas brings much anticipation and joy at this time of year. In school we have been focusing very much on the true meaning of Christmas during our journey through Advent - on the qualities of hope, peace, love and joy. I do hope that many of you will be celebrating Christmas and the incarnation of Christ by attending church on Christmas Day.

Attendance Matters!

The Department for Education (DfE) and Essex Local Authority continue to communicate a clear message on the critical importance of not disrupting the education of children and young people by promoting regular school attendance and punctuality. This is fully supported by the Governing Body of St Thomas of Canterbury Church of England Primary School, as set out in 'Working Together to Improve School Attendance'.

School attendance is mandatory. Enabling children and young people to attend their education setting regularly continues to be a national priority. All children must attend school every day and arrive on time. Sickness absence must be reported via the Studybugs app. Leave of absence will only be granted in very exceptional circumstances.

In the New Year, through our partnership with **Aquinas School Attendance Provision**, we will continue to monitor and contact parents/carers of children who have attendance of below 90% - currently there are 81 children who fall in to this category. These children are identified as 'persistent absentees' and we will want to identify any barriers to regular attendance and offer support, advice and guidance as appropriate.
