Multi Schools Council – Bronze Award!

I am delighted to inform you that St Thomas of Canterbury Church of England Primary School has been awarded our Bronze Award for our engagement and involvement in the Multi Schools Council. Our confirmation letter from Kierran Pearce (Multi Schools Council Lead) states:

I am delighted that you have achieved our BRONZE award! We were particularly impressed with the way you clearly celebrate children with SEND across the school and how you clearly use a lot of SEND aware language across the school. The next step is to arrange a suitable time for us to come and present your certificate!



The Multi Schools Council prompts regular meetings for young people with SEND to come together to discuss what they see as the most important topics for them, and to translate those discussions into projects that improve experiences of other children with SEND. I am very grateful to Mrs Pritchard (MSC Lead) and all the children who have represented our school so well and worked so hard in gaining our Bronze Award. I am sure you will join me in congratulating them on this wonderful achievement. I know that they are already planning on how to achieve our Silver Award!!

School Uniform

We appear to have an increasing number of children arriving to school with the incorrect school uniform. This is particularly a problem with children in Key Stage 2 having no tie and children across the primary school with incorrect footwear. We take great pride in our appearance and have high expectations of children's presentation. Please can I ask both parents/carers and children to help support this by ensuring they are correctly dressed for school. School ties for children in Key Stage 2 can be purchased via your child's ParentPay account at the price of £4.00 – once it has been paid for online we will issue the school tie to your child via the School Office. Please remember to put your child's name on it!

REMINDER: Year 3 Swimming



Lessons for the children in Year 3 (3CA & 3B) will begin on Friday 7th February 2025. I would like to remind parents that we very much rely on your payments to cover the cost of swimming lessons of £54 per child. In recent years we have seen the cost of pool hire rise at St. Helen's as well as the cost of swimming teachers increase substantially. I hope you will agree that this remains excellent value for money. If there are reasons why your child cannot take part in

swimming lessons this must be discussed with your child's classteacher or the School Office. Please ensure your child has the correct swimming kit in school on Friday's. Please could we encourage you to make a prompt payment via our online payment system www.parentpay.com. If you feel you may have difficulty in paying this amount and would like to discuss this confidentially then please arrange to speak with Mrs Lawrence in the School Office. Thank you for your support and understanding in this matter.

May I remind you that all children have to wear a suitable costume for swimming (no beach wear!) and a swimming hat. Swimming hats are available via ParentPay at a cost of £4.00. It is a really good idea to write your child's name on their hat in large letters in a thick permanent marker as this helps the swimming teachers to call their names and also reduces the risk of it becoming lost.

Attendance Matters

We are rapidly heading towards the half-way mark of the school academic year. This is a good time to share with you some of our school attendance data.

Currently our whole school attendance data for the year to date stands at **94.4%** This is below the national average of **95.1%** It is also below our school agreed target of **96%**.

Do not be misled by the figures being in the 90% range. Although 94.4% sounds good....it is not and it needs to improve!

Figures also show that <u>75 of our children are identified as persistent absentees</u> which is where their attendance falls below 90% - this equates to doing an average of a 4½ day week!!

When we break it down by Year Group it shows some interesting trends:

EYFS/Reception	92.8%
Year 1	93.1%
Year 2	93.5%
Year 3	95.8%
Year 4	95.2%
Year 5	94.8%
Year 6	93.3%

We all appreciate that there are times when children are unwell and need to be absent from school – however this should be the exception not the rule. The winter months have seen lots of children (and adults) suffering with seasonal illnesses but we hope once we head into the spring months this will improve.

Essex Attendance Specialist Team now have a dedicated Parent/Carer Contact Line. This line is solely for parents/carers to make contact for advice and guidance around school attendance. The phoneline enables parents/carers to leave their name and contact number for a call back from one of the AST Specialists. The phoneline is strictly for parents/carers and is accessed by the team twice weekly.

Please continue to support us in promoting regular attendance and arriving for school on time each day. We want to be able to close the gap between our attendance data and that achieved nationally, and ultimately hit our target of 96% Thank you for your continued support!

Have You Tried a School Dinner?



Earlier this week we sent out details via Parent Hub about how to apply for free school meals (FSM). We are trying to encourage as many children as possible to take up our fantastic school meals which rotate through a 3-week rolling menu. These menus have been updated to reflect meals which our children enjoy whilst at the same time being healthy and nutritionally balanced.


The current menus are displayed on the school website (<u>www.stthomaspri.org</u>) and can be found via the home page and then selecting the 'Information for Parents' tab. Here you can look at the menu choices and see what is on offer.

Please do take a look at these menus with your child/ren and see if you can find a few favourites to enjoy. All children in Reception and Key Stage 1 (Year 1 & 2) are entitled to a free hot school dinner everyday. In Key Stage 2 (Year 3, 4, 5 & 6) the cost of a school meal is £2.53 a day (unless you have applied for and been awarded benefits related free school meals). This reflects excellent value for money and I know that Mrs Turner (Catering Manager) and her catering team put a great deal of love and effort into producing our fantastic school meals!

Finally....

We appreciate that the past week has been challenging for our school community in terms of your journey to and from school. With road works popping up all over Brentwood and the temporary traffic lights on Shenfield Road many of us have been caught out and had our journey times unexpectedly lengthened. Thank you for your patience.
