

Staffing Update

Some of you may have spotted, or your children may have mentioned, that **Miss Lilly Berner** has been in school over the last couple of weeks completing some 'keeping in touch' (KIT) days as she prepares to return from maternity leave after the Easter holiday. Miss Berner will be returning on a part-time basis and will be contracted to work on a Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. On a Monday and Tuesday, Miss Berner will take on responsibility for teaching in 4TW (4BW) as Mrs Tucker's maternity leave contract comes to an end. Miss Berner will continue to work alongside Mrs Whitaker to take on responsibility for teaching in this Year 4 class. On a Wednesday Miss Berner will cover planning, preparation and assessment (PPA) time across the primary school.

I am sure many of you will join me in thanking **Mrs Mel Tucker** for all her hard work, dedication and commitment in 4TW this academic year. I know she has thoroughly enjoyed her time teaching in Year 4 and has built up many positive relationships with children, parents and carers. Thankfully we are not saying goodbye to Mrs Tucker as she will remain in school on a Tuesday to assist and support our PPA provision.

School Uniform – Reminder!

I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents/carers that <u>AFTER</u> the Easter break all children must be wearing <u>summer uniform</u> as set out in the school prospectus. The Governing Body continue to uphold high expectations by regularly reviewing and tightening up the uniform policy and we would request that all parents/carers adhere to this. From the beginning of the summer term all children <u>must</u> wear summer uniform as set out in the school prospectus and home school diaries.

SUMMER

[Must be worn for the summer term and first half of the autumn term]

EYFS/Key Stage 1

Green gingham check dress, *bottle green cardigan or jumper, White socks <u>must</u> be worn.

Grey tailored shorts or tailored trousers, *white polo shirt, *bottle green jumper Grey or black socks only.

Key Stage 2

Green gingham check dress (compulsory for Year 3 & 4) and/or *white polo shirt with grey skirt (Year 5 & 6 have option of both). *bottle green cardigan or jumper,

White socks <u>must</u> be worn.

- *white polo shirt, Grey tailored shorts or tailored trousers,
- *bottle green jumper, Grey or black socks <u>only</u>.

N.B. Items marked * must have the school badge embroidered on the garment.

Shoes need to be sensible black leather (not boots) with soft soles or leather sandals (black or brown). <u>Black trainers are not permitted.</u> We do not like lights or toys in the shoes so please bear this in mind when you are purchasing any new shoes. Incorrect or inappropriate uniform will be flagged up in the new term by putting a gentle reminder sticker in your child's home school diary. Please help support us in achieving greater consistency, smarter presentation and a sense of pride – thank you.

<u>A reminder</u> - jewellery can cause problems in school due to Health & Safety requirements. Children may wear an inexpensive named watch to school providing it is not too big or colourful and they will not be distracted by wearing it. <u>Smart watches are not permitted in school.</u> Smart watches can cause issues with data protection and data security if these devices are trying to access our school Wi-Fi or have the ability to record and/or capture video or audio. No bracelets, rings or necklaces are permitted.

Children are not allowed to wear earrings for PE under any circumstances so it makes sense to leave these at home altogether. However, if you insist on your child wearing earrings, please ensure they are plain gold or silver studs and that they are capable of taking their earrings out themselves.

May I also remind you that long hair must be tied back with a black, white or green hairband. Children's hair should not be coloured or have patterns shaved into it.

REMINDER: Parents' Evening – 2nd & 3rd April 2025

On Friday last week you will have received a Parent Hub message with details about booking appointments for Parents' Evening. Spring term Parents' Evening will be taking place on Wednesday 2nd April and Thursday 3rd April 2025 – 4:00 – 7:00p.m.

Thank you to all those parents/carers who have accessed SchoolCloud and booked your parents' evening appointments for next week - 80% have signed up so far! If you have yet to make your appointment you have until 12 noon on Monday 31st March 2025 to do so – don't miss out!



*PLEASE NOTE: The booking window will be open for 10-days. Parents/carers MUST book within this time frame. We will not allow any bookings after the booking window has closed – there will be no exceptions. In previous years we have had parents/carers asking to make late bookings. This causes a great deal of additional administrative work and does not allow teaching staff adequate time to prepare for the meetings. Please support us by ensuring you make your booking on time!

Children must not attend in-person or virtual video meetings as it is important that they are conducted in a quiet, professional manner and parents and classteachers can have discussions without distraction and interruptions, maximising the limited time. I hope you have had sufficient time to arrange necessary child care if needed. It is very unfair on parents who do make these arrangements when others attempt to bring their children along. Please be respectful towards others and I thank you for your support in this matter.

It is very clear from monitoring the appointment booking system that there is still an appetite for remote virtual appointments and our decision to make available hybrid appointments has proved to be well supported. Please remember that each date (Wednesday 2^{nd} & Thursday 3^{rd}) have been split into two blocks of appointment types. Face-to-face meetings will run between 4:00 - 5:00p.m. with remote virtual appointments between 5:00 - 7:00p.m. Whether you choose to attend virtually or in-person the appointment time will be strictly timed to 10 minutes.

If you are arriving for a face-to-face appointment you will need to enter via the main School Office reception entrance. From here you will be escorted by one of our Year 6 House Captains to your child's classroom. Don't worry if you are not sure where to go – there will be a friendly face to guide you in the right direction! Please do not arrive too early for your appointment – 5 minutes beforehand should be enough.

When you arrive if the appointment slot before you has not concluded we would ask you to sit on the seats provided outside the classroom and wait for the classteacher to invite you in. Once your appointment has finished you can exit the school via the main entrance.

Parents' & Visitors' Conduct Policy

At our Governing Body meeting yesterday the Governors approved and ratified our Parents' & Visitors' Conduct Policy. A copy of this policy has been circulated with this newsletter and will also be freely available from the school website (www.stthomaspri.org)

We are very grateful to the vast majority of parents/carers and others visiting our school who are keen to work with us and are supportive of the school – thank you! However, it saddens me to report that on an increasingly regular basis, we are experiencing negative attitudes towards the school which are expressed with aggression and verbal and intimidating behaviour. This is happening both face-to-face and through telephone and email communication.

All members of staff have the right to work without fear of violence, intimidation and abuse. We expect all parents/carers and other visitors to behave in a reasonable, respectful way towards members of school staff. The Parents' & Visitors' Conduct Policy outlines the steps that will be taken where behaviour is unacceptable. In extreme circumstances, unacceptable behaviour may result in the Local Authority and/or the Police being informed of the incident.
