School Dinners – September 2025

Following a meeting of the Finance and Premises Committee of the Governing Body of St Thomas of Canterbury Church of England Primary School, a decision has now been made to increase the daily cost of school meals from September 2025.

This is a decision that has not been taken lightly, but as you will be fully aware, the cost of food, fuel, transportation and catering staff pay continues to increase year on year. I am certain we have all seen this reflected in our own household shopping bills. After carefully reviewing our catering trading accounts and factoring in these increased costs it has been decided that school meals will increase to £2.69 per day (£13.45 a week) from September 2025.

For parents/carers of children in EYFS and Key Stage 1, this is for information only as your children will still be eligible for universal infant free school meals as set out by the Department for Education (DfE). However, for parents/carers of Year 2 children moving in to Key Stage 2 and for the rest of the Primary School parent/carer community this will impact on you from the beginning of the new academic year. However, if you think you may be eligible for benefits related free school meals then please read the eligibility criteria on the school website or visit the Essex County Council website or contact the school office for further details and support.

Please be rest assured that this was not an easy decision but we cannot operate our catering trading accounts at a loss. Thank you for your support and understanding.

Classes 2025-2026

At this time of year we turn our attention and energies to finalising the classes for the new academic year starting in September 2025. Allocating children and teachers to classes is an extremely complex and time consuming process which takes in to account many contextual and competing factors. Decisions made in order to structure these classes are not done lightly or quickly, but are based on professional judgement and consideration for all children within each cohort.

Moving just one child can have huge reprecussions and acts as a domino effect through the year group. Classes are now finalised; the decisions are not open to negotiation in our school.

Change will naturally cause some anxiety and some people will initially worry about the new academic year ahead. However, the staff at our school have years of experience in supporting this process and will make sure that everyone settles in well to their new classes. Thank you for your trust and understanding.

You and your child will be notified of their new class and classteacher on Friday 11th July 2025 when they bring home their end of year annual report.

Story Garden - Summer Reading Challenge 2025

Story Garden – Adventures in Nature and the Great Outdoors - is coming to a library near you this summer!

This year's Summer Reading Challenge will inspire children to tap into the world of imagination and reading, exploring the magical connection between storytelling and nature.

Children will join our wonderful characters, created by the brilliant children's illustrator Dapo Adeola, whose stunning illustrations bring the Story Garden theme to life; creating an enchanted world where children can find magical creatures, plants and flowers to inspire their next reading adventure.


The challenge runs from Saturday 19th July to Saturday 6th September 2025 in all Essex libraries and mobile libraries. There will also be a special early joiners' day on Saturday 12th July.

There are six stickers for children to collect over the summer. They earn them by talking about the books they have read, writing a book review, creating a piece of art inspired by their book or attending a library event. After collecting six stickers, they earn their certificate and medal.

Children can read any library book of their choice; fiction, non-fiction, picture books or books they share with parents and carers – they all count. Children under four are not forgotten, with a special version of Story Garden just for them.

The Summer Reading Challenge is delivered by libraries and produced by The Reading Agency. It is open to all children, free of charge.
