St Thomas' Bookopoly & Reading Brick Road Reading Awards

Children in KS2 have been excitedly reading their way across our 'Bookopoly' Board, where familiar colours and railway stations correspond to book genres. In EYFS and KS1, children have the opportunity to read/share books according to author surname, collecting awards as they go. To date, in KS2, we have awarded 147 Bronze Awards, 67 Silver Awards, 50 Gold Awards and 16 Platinum Reading Awards! In EYFS & KS1, we have awarded 178 Bronze Scarecrow Awards, 78 Silver Tin Man Awards, 21 Gold Lion Reading Awards , 4 Ruby Reading Awards and 2 Emerald Reading Awards (congratulations to Elle in 1NC and Bea in 2K!).

Audio and e- Books from Brentwood Library

I was extremely excited to discover that using the Borrow Box app, all library users can access (free of charge) thousands of e-books, e-graphic novels and e-magazines. You can borrow up to 10 e-books, 10 e-audio and 10 e-magazines at any one time for a period of three weeks. This is in addition to the items through your normal Essex library card. There are no overdue charges and items will be automatically returned at the end of the three-week loan period. The app can be tailored to suit personal reading preferences and needs.

This year's World Book Day is Science-themed, so in the KS1 Library, we will be updating "Our Favourite Books" shelf display to reflect our well-thumbed STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) inspired reads.



Wonderblocks is coming to CBeebies soon. Perfect for our EYFS and KS1 children, this show's leading duo, excitable Go and methodical Stop, will showcase the perfect balance of action and thought. They will be showing core skills like problem-solving, planning, pattern recognition and sequencing. Perfect for budding coders and inquisitive minds everywhere.

Sleep Tight Science Podcast (as the name suggests) is a bedtime science show for children (aimed at Upper KS2 listeners) which aims to make science accessible and enjoyable.
