
St Thomas' Bookopoly & Reading Brick Road Reading Awards

Wow! What a phenomenal year we have had with our Reading Awards!

This year, in KS2, we have awarded <u>234 Bronze Awards</u>, <u>149 Silver</u> Awards, <u>75 Gold Awards</u> and 26 Platinum Reading Awards!

In EYFS & KS1, we have awarded <u>220 Bronze Scarecrow Awards</u>, <u>165 Silver Tin Man Awards</u>, <u>108 Gold Lion Reading Awards</u>, <u>85 Ruby Reading Awards</u> and <u>52 Emerald Reading Awards</u>! In KS2, 21 children also took part in the <u>Diamond Reading Award challenge</u>, where they had the opportunity to be critical thinkers and be an influencer amongst their peers.

Due to their popularity this year, children will again be able to take part in these Reading Awards at the start of the autumn term in September.

Summer Holiday Bookish Ideas


