Children in KS2 have been excitedly reading their way across our 'Bookopoly' Board, where familiar colours and railway stations correspond to book genres. In EYFS and KS1, children have the opportunity to read/share books according to author surname, collecting awards as they go. To date, in KS2, we have awarded 122 Bronze Awards, 44 Silver Awards, 29 Gold Awards and 13 Platinum Reading Awards! In EYFS & KS1, we have awarded 96 Bronze Scarecrow Awards, 37 Silver Tin Man Awards and 2 Gold Lion Reading Awards!

Audio Books

Struggling to come up with Christmas present ideas? Audio books have been a game changer with my children. They will happily listen to part of a story most evenings. While still available as CDs (which can be found in Brentwood Library), audio book apps are now extremely popular. Audible is a favourite of mine, which has the benefit of a month's free trial before moving on to a reasonably-priced monthly subscription. You can also find free to listen to audio books on YouTube. Each half term, I include a selection of audiobooks (free to listen to where possible) that link to book displays in the KS1 Library and Book Reviews (which feature in the KS2 Library). Audio books are also a brilliant way for children to work towards their St Thomas' Reading Street Bookopoly Awards in the KS2 Library.




Book Reviews, Audio Books and Author Chats


