

Children in KS2 continue to eagerly read their way across our 'Bookopoly' Board, where familiar colours and railway stations correspond to book genres. In EYFS and KS1, children have the opportunity to read/share books according to author surname, collecting awards as they go. To date, in KS2, we have awarded 159 Bronze Awards, 75 Gold Awards and 20 Platinum Reading Awards! In EYFS & KS1, we have awarded 163 Bronze Scarecrow Awards, 119 Silver Tin Man Awards, 75 Gold Lion Reading Awards, 48 Ruby Reading Awards and 11 Emerald Reading Awards!
